RECIPE OF THE MONTH from Jan Schraeder**GO TO BED MINTS**

2 egg whites, room temperature
Pinch of salt
½ tsp. cream of tartar
2-3 drops green food coloring
¾ C sugar
6 oz. mint flavored chocolate morsels
4 drops mint extract

Pre-heat oven to 375 degrees. Beat egg whites and cream of tartar while gradually adding the sugar, salt, food coloring and extract. When stiff peaks have formed stop beating and fold in mint flavored morsels. Drop teaspoons full of the mixture onto an ungreased cookie sheet. Shut off the oven, put the cookie sheet in, go to bed and you will have cookies in the morning. Makes 50 to 55 cookies.

Plain chocolate morsels can be used if mint ones are not available.

You can make these during the day allowing 8 hours of oven time.

These cookies freeze well. The ones you had in Coffeyville had been in my freezer since Christmas. Good luck!

KAHLUA

6 cups sugar
1 cup instant coffee
4 cups boiling water
1.75 liter cheap vodka
4 teaspoons vanilla
Mix sugar and coffee, pour boiling water over mixture. Stir and let stand till cooled. Add vanilla and vodka. Drink immediately and don't forget to put some in your Birdie Bottle! **ENJOY**

From the Handicap Chair.....

Sometimes you will find that when posting your score in GHIN, you cannot post using "hole-by-hole" to enter your score and letting GHIN adjust your score. Such was the case recently at the Hillcrest Golf Course in Coffeyville. Such cases are the result of the golf course not sending in their scorecard to GHIN so that each hole is handicapped for that course. Just as a refresher.....when you are met with that situation, you will need to adjust your score and enter it as your total adjusted score. You will need to use your course handicap to go through the scorecard starting with the #1 *handicap* hole and continuing thru the #18 *handicap* hole to use your handicap strokes. If your handicap is more than 18, start back at the #1 handicap hole and continue until you have no more handicap strokes to use. If your hole score is more than par+2+your given handicap strokes, then adjust your score down so that it equals par+2+your handicap strokes. (For example, your score for the #1 handicap hole was 10 and par for that hole was 5 and you have 2 handicap strokes for that hole. Par+2+ your 2 handicap strokes = 9. Therefore, your adjusted score for that hole is 9.

Also, remember that if you have made no scores higher than double bogey, you will have nothing to adjust so you have no figuring to do. And, if your handicap is 36, it's easy as you have 2 handicap strokes per hole! That makes it easy!!

Fortunately, you will probably find in the GHIN app when you are posting, that most courses have will have hole-by-hole posting. *Peggy*

USGA RULE REGARDING TREE ROOTS



What to do if faced with this dilemma ...

Where a **tree root** interferes with **the** lie of the player's ball or **the** area of **the** player's intended swing, relief without penalty may be taken under Rule 25-1(i). **That is, the ball** may be lifted and dropped within one club-length of, and not nearer to **the** hole than, **the** nearest point of relief.
